Manweek 2007 Summary

- Overall, a success
 - Turnout slightly lower than expected
 - Consistent, from submissions to registrations
 - However, excellent feedback from attendees that did attend
- Online survey
 - "How would you rate Manweek on scale 1-5"
 - 100% rate 4 or higher (4 83%, 5 17%)
 - "If fees remain in the same ballpark, will they make it difficult for y ou to attend in the future?"
 - 71% no, 29% yes
 - "Would you attend another Manweek in the future?"






- The third largest city in Japan (population of 2.6 M) with I
