Structuring the N&S management research area

- Created a N&S management taxonomy
 - Together with Emanics NoE & IRTF-NMRG
- Has been implemented within the JEMS system
- Purpose:
 - For authors: fixed keywords to chose from
 - For reviewers:
 - Fixed keywords to indicate area of expertise / interest
 - No need to continuously enter expertise again
 - For organizers: match papers and reviewers
 - ***Improve Quality of Reviews***

Fight against (self-)plagiarism and no-shows

- Plagiarism:
 - IEEE has clear procedures
 - Maintain list of cases
 - Tools are now implemented in JEMS (and EDAS)
- Self-plagiarism
 - Follow IEEE guidelines
 - Increase awareness
- No-shows
 - Maintain list of cases
- ***Use this information for paper selection***

IEEE Publications has long maintained the policy that verbatim copying of another's work (plagiarism) is unacceptable author conduct.

In November 2002, the IEEE Board of Directors approved a new policy on Duplicate Publication and Self-Plagiarism. This policy is found in the IEEE Policies document, Sections 6.4.1B(f) and 6.4.1B(h). These two sections are given below.

(f) Plagiarism is unacceptable. The verbatim copying or reuse of one's own research) as indicated in paragraph "h" below) is considered another form of plagiarism or self-plagiarism; it is unacceptable.

(h) Except as indicated in Section 6.3.4 (Multiple Publication of Original Technical Material in IEEE Periodicals), authors should only submit original work that has **neither appeared elsewhere for publication, nor which is under review for another refereed publication. If authors have used their own previously published work(s) as a basis for a new submission, they are required to cite the previous work(s) and very briefly indicate how the new submission offers substantial novel contributions beyond those of the previously published work(s).**

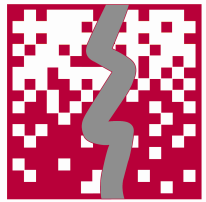

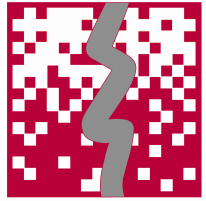

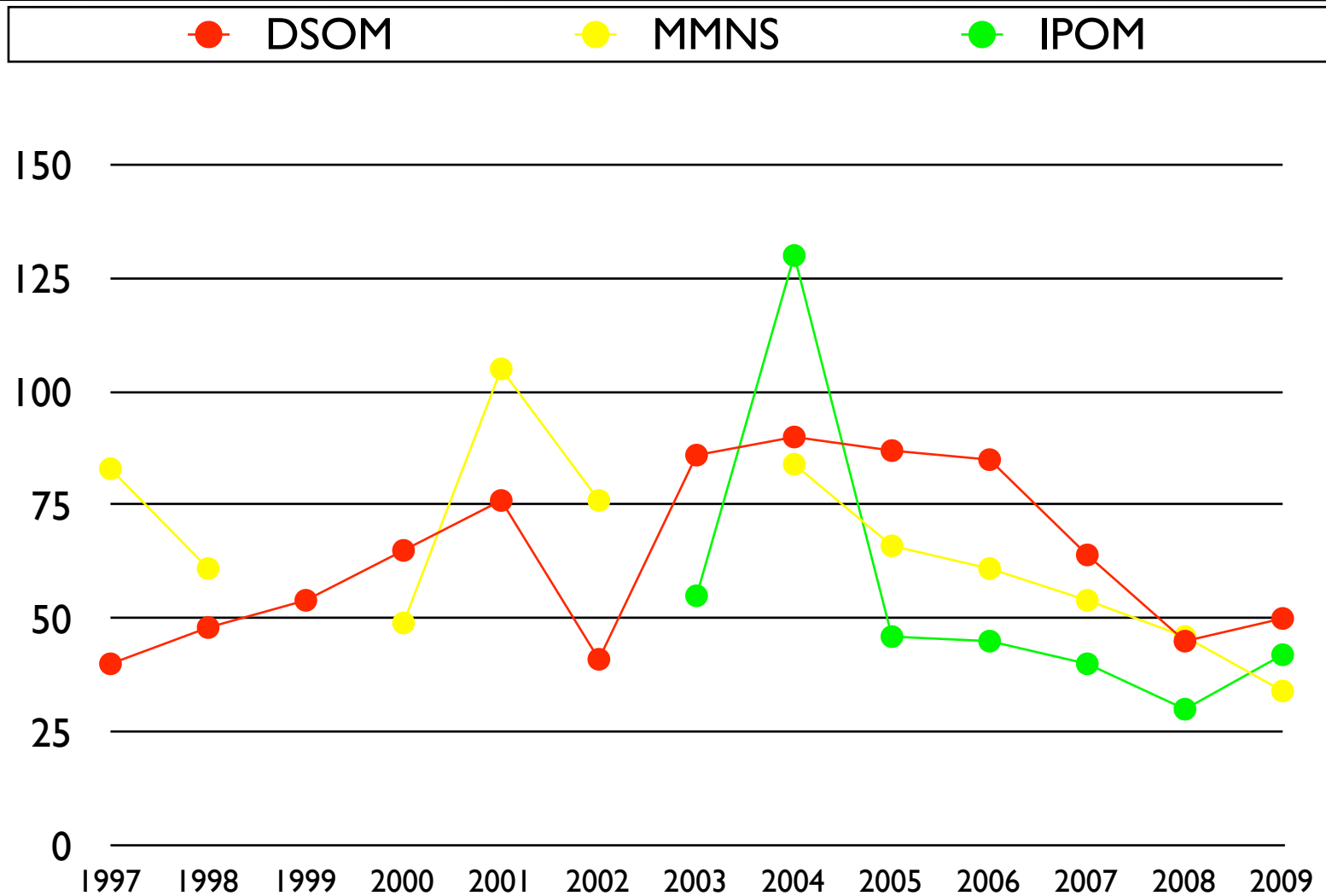

Avoid Anonymous Online Conference Ranking Sites

This is a site dedicated to exposing the scheme of some online anonymous ranking sites, including cs-conference-ranking.org and conference-ranking.net (.com and .org as well). *My evidence shows that these two sites are created to promote specific multi-conferences and cannot be trusted.*

It seems that some institutes or researchers have begun to use their results to review applications and select conferences. *My suggestion is: unless these sites disclose the people behind the ranking and disclose the methods and data for their ranking results, you should not trust them and use their results for any means.* However, I do not endorse any ranking site even the above information is disclosed. Also, ranking results are always up for interpretation. This web page is created to express my personal opinion of online conference ranking, and I am not responsible of any damage to any person (or organization) because of the content in rankingexpose.com (this site). Proven facts of conference-ranking.net:

Conference ranking

- Seems we can not avoid ranking taking place
- Instead of relying on questionable lists, it might be better to do it ourselves
- Must be a transparent process
- Must be limited to networking conferences
- IFIP WG6.6 and IEEE CNOM must work together (and, if possible, ACM)
- Must use metrics from conference management systems (EDAS, JEMS, ...)
- First step is to define possible metrics
